Do we hurt the poor with our "help"? My sister's family is poor but always has money for cigarettes, alcohol, and cell phones because they get help from the government and charities. Maybe they'd make more of an effort to find and keep jobs if they couldn't afford those things. Christ said we should help the poor, but is this "help" actually perpetuating the problem?

Dear Sophie,

When I was growing up with seven siblings, my mother amazed me. Working with a limited budget - and at times receiving help - she shopped sales and cut coupons. We ate chicken when it was on sale. We didn't eat it when it wasn't. She also bought powdered milk - yuk!

We have rules to keep people from doing things like using food stamps to buy cigarettes or beer. But, as you point out, some people either find ways around the rules or spend the money the food stamps free up on nonessentials instead of saving it for a rainy day.

So what should we do? We're called to help each other have basic necessities: food, shelter, clothing, and medical care. We must do what we can to be sure the money we give is used wisely, but there's always the possibility that it won't be.

Bottom line: We're called to help those in need, and those in need are called to use our help wisely. But even when they don't, we can take comfort in the peace of mind and soul that comes from knowing we're modeling Jesus when we try our best to help.




