It's that time again, summer vacation is quickly approaching! As you enter the church today you will notice the **Kid's Pak** bags on the stands near each entrance. The items in the bags will help parents satisfy those ravenous appetites during summer vacation when school lunches are not longer available. The list of needed items is on a sheet on the outside of each bag. Most of these items are available at Dollar Stores.

If you do not wish to fill a complete bag, we hope that you will be able to supply some needed items. Please place these items in a separate bag. We need canned spaghettio's, crackers, peanut butter, 4 or 6 pk of fruit cups (any kind), canisters of presweetened drink mix (leomonade or Kool aid), 4 pk of juice boxes (100% juice), boxes of granola or cereal bars, 4 pk of pudding cups, boxes of hot chocolate, snack size raisin pkgs.

The filled bags may be returned at anytime as we will be giving them out along with our regular monthly food supplement in June, July and August. Our first distribution date is June 25. We need about 150 bags each month in order to provide a bag for each child. **Kid's Pak** bags will be available all summer in the rack at the back of the church. We are most grateful for anything you can do to help parents feed their children this summer. Hunger never takes a vacation! Our kids will thank you!

How can I explain the Trinity to a non-Catholic?

I was using a clover to explain the Trinity to my non-Catholic sister-in-law, and I wasn't successful. She says the leaves of a clover are separate, and sharing a stem doesn't mean they're one entity. How can I get her to understand?

Legend tells us Saint Patrick used a shamrock to speak about the God who is one and three, but that doesn't mean everyone will find clover imagery convincing.

It took hundreds of years, lots of argument, and multiple Church councils to refine the basic outline of orthodox Christian belief in the Trinitarian nature of God, so it's no great shock that you can't quickly break it down into convincing sound bites for a resistant in-law.

Perhaps you should concentrate on the way humans came to know the Trinitarian God, how we have encountered the God who is all at once Father, Son, and Spirit in the events of history and revelation. In sharing the way Christians have gradually come to understand what we do about the nature of the God who saves us, you can speak of how that understanding leads us to pray.

At our liturgies we have a distinct pattern of praying to the Father, through the Son, in the Spirit. There's more than a shamrock to discuss in all of that. And don't forget the creed we pray each Sunday. Discussions like yours are what the creed was made for.


