Questions Catholics Ask



Who Composed the Psalms?

"I will praise your name forever," says the psalm, "my king and my God" - but who's the "I"? Did King David really write every psalm? The short answer: certainly not all. Some 73 of the 150 psalms claim David's authorship; a few of them are more likely to be by the historical king than others, in the view of most scholars. Many psalms have subtitles linking each one to an event in David's life; these subheadings likely have little historical value. The Book of Psalms we have today is a compilation reflecting generations of liturgical songwriting - perhaps as long as 500 years.

Was David a composer of psalms at all? The Bible tells us he was among other things a skilled player of stringed instruments. Not every musician writes their own music, but in the cycle of stories about David (1 Samuel 16 through 1 Kings 2:11) he does chant a few songs.

We also know David liked to dance and was greatly interested in liturgy. It's conceivable that a man of his talents and interests might have written hymns for ritual use or at least commissioned some to be written. David's patronage may have been enough to render him the "godfather" of the Book of Psalms.
